RE: Notice of Allocations for Education Jobs Fund Program

The Education Jobs Fund program (Ed Jobs) is a new Federal program that provides \$10 billion in assistance to States to save or create education jobs for the 2010-2011 school year authorized in Public Law No. 111-226 (Act), which President Obama signed into law on August 10, 2010.

The U.S. Department of Education determined the amount of funding for each State by formula on the basis of (1) its relative population of individuals who are aged 5 to 24, and (2) its relative total population. The amount allocated to Colorado is \$159,521,991. Of the amount allocated, up to 2% may be used for State level administration of the program totaling \$3,190,440. Therefore, a minimum of \$156,331,551 will be available for distribution to Colorado school districts/LEAs. Please see Appendix A for all State allocations.

The Ed Jobs program supports educational and related services during the 2010-2011 school year. The funds are available for obligations that occur as of August 10, 2010. An LEA that has funds remaining after the 2010-2011 school year may use those remaining funds through September 30, 2012. This period includes the additional year of fund availability authorized under the Tydings Amendment (Section 421(b)(1) of the General Education Provisions Act (GEPA), 20 U.S.C. 1225(b)(1)).

The Governor may request Ed Jobs funding by submitting an application no later than September 9, 2010, and intends to do so. Based on the understanding of the Governor's Office, the State believes it will qualify under the Maintenance-of Effort (MOE) provisions in the Ed Jobs program, making these funds available to Colorado school districts.

The Governor has decided to distribute the Federal Ed Jobs funds "through" the State's primary elementary and secondary education funding formula (Public School Finance Act – Total Program Funding calculation), rather than based on relative shares of funds under Part A of Title I of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA).

This communication is to provide information regarding the amount of allocations for each school district and the Charter School Institute so school districts may begin planning for its use. The allocations are based on a calculation that would in essence reduce the "State Budget Stabilization Factor". The result is an allocation of funding equal to 2.9% of the district's Total Program Funding, if the district's funding was reduced by an amount ranging from 3.63% to 6.35% for FY2010-11, including the amount a district would be required to use from its Total Program funding to buyout categorical program funding provided by the State.

Since the allocations are based on the Total Program calculation as used for State Appropriations, please remember that the Total Program calculation will be adjusted in December to account for actual pupil counts, assessed valuations, etc. This funding will also be re-calculated at that time. School districts shall not draw down more than 50% of the Jobs Ed funding prior to December 31, 2010.

The School Finance formula was used for the purpose of calculating the district-by-district allocations, but the funding will not be distributed through the state share payments. We are not certain of the process for distribution of the Jobs Ed monies at the current time, but it will most likely mirror the requests for funds and payment processes used for other ARRA monies within the department.

Further guidance to school districts will be forthcoming.
